Dear Summit Family,

As we conclude our first semester and approach our holiday break, I want to extend my deepest gratitude for the partnership and support of our staff, families, and community members in service of our students at Summit. Together, we've accomplished so much in this first half of the school year in deepening and growing our mission of engaging students in learning experiences that stimulate discovery, inspire excellence, and nurture a positive influence in an ever-changing world. To name just a few of the many examples of our shared impact through the first semester of the school year:

- We've grown to serve 300 students across Kindergarten through 12th grade and applications for the 2024-25 school year are currently on track to exceed any previous school year.
- We've made strides in our ongoing commitment to upholding high standards of excellence for our students, reflected in continued growth in our students' academic achievement, including:
 - on mid-year math growth assessments, our K-8 students exceeded the performance of any previous year over the four years in which we've administered the assessment with 80% of students meeting or exceeding grade level standards for the mid-year. (Students will take their mid-year reading growth assessments in January).
 - On fall ACT practice tests, our 11th graders achieved the highest average composite score of any previous 11th grade Summit class, and our 9th graders achieved the highest average composite score of any previous 9th grade Summit class
- Our senior class applied to 50 different colleges and universities across the United States--more than any previous class--and to-date has received acceptances from over 18 different colleges and counting.
- Our students have participated in 38 off-campus learning experiences between August and December, including service learning, outdoor leadership, academic field trips, and college visits.
- Our athletics program has continued to grow in both participation and performance--with record level participation in middle school and high school, a conference championship in middle school girls and boys cross country and girls volleyball, and a conference runner-up finish in middle school boys soccer.
- Our student artists and musicians showcased their many talents in our Holiday Music performance.
- The Summit Charter School Foundation led another highly successful Festival of Trees event to raise vital funds that directly support the education of our students as well as benefiting many community nonprofits and charities.
- We're continuing to make progress in expanding Summit's campus facilities to meet the needs of our growing student population, including the opening of a brand new fitness center in August and breaking ground on our new high school building, which is currently on-track to open in the fall of 2024!

We are incredibly grateful for the generosity of support from across our Summit family in service of our students that have made these accomplishments possible. We wish you the very happiest of holidays!


